FOREWORD

Coen Teulings, IYMF President

2020 was a challenging year for all of us. Indeed, we had to adapt our ways of working according to the international health situation, which largely prevented the face-to-face meetings that were planned in many of our European and Belgian projects. But this has allowed us to be resilient and innovative and to explore other ways of working together, including tools such as digitalization and streaming. It has awakened in us a need for innovation and discovery that we have been able to put to good use.

This year has also made us realize that our actions in the field of social inclusion through art are more relevant and essential than ever to give back to everyone the desire to live and joy, and to encourage creativity, mutual aid and empathy. All qualities that the arts transmit in a natural way.

In 2020, almost all cultural venues have come to a standstill and streaming on the Internet has become the main vehicle for the arts but also for the teaching of artistic disciplines. The International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation and the MUS-E Network were no exceptions and had to take a turn and adapt their activities. All our projects were impacted deeply. Let's come back on some of them:

THE MUS-E NETWORK

The MUS-E Network and all the MUS-E Organizations active in Europe, Brazil and Israel and implementing artistic sessions in primary schools and other institutions for disadvantaged and vulnerable learners have shown all their creativity and innovative spirit.

The artists of the programme have been able to create online courses, artistic initiatives to keep the children engaged in the school. The apparition of the digital technologies in the MUS-E Programme may have produced a deep reflection on the future of the programme and its need for transformation and innovation as much as it has shed a light on the necessity of such a programme in Europe to build resilient school systems.

HOMELANDS, PLACES OF BELONGING

Through this project, we implement co-creative trainings for refugee and newcomer artists and co-creative workshops involving the local communities. We act on the ground in local cultural and artistic centers. Those centers being closed, it was very hard to maintain the activities. We have experienced great difficulties in keeping the spirit up of the public we are working with. Being an artist in this period is very difficult. Coming from another country and trying to establish oneself as an artist in a new homecountry is even more difficult. Some of the refugee and newcomer artists could not proceed and had to stop their artistic profesional activity to find another professional direction. The crisis revealed once more the great necessity to maintain and continue to create opportunities of exchanges between newcomer and local communities, to continue to provide trainings for artists and offer cultural events and activities that provide a sense of belonging, a sense of empowerement and bonds in our societies. Homelands, places of belonging also had to rethink and adapt its activities and of course confront the digital technologies and distant training or learning activities on the arts.

OUR CONCERTS

Our concerts were of course deeply impacted as well as our network of artists ambassadors for whom we are constantly trying to provide with new artistic opportunities. Our great multicultural concerts are part of our the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation DNA. Our annual concert is not only a milestone of the year in the way we keep the bond with people and promote strong messages of peace, tolerance and intercultural dialogue, it is also a very important event for the Foundation financial stability. Again, this was a challenge. But very early in the crisis we tried to create musical content, to keep on providing opportunities for musicians and to offer high-quality online concerts. We started with a short video of the Italian song «cade l'oliva» with some of our artists ambassadors and young European musicians, then a concert from home with Matthieu Saglio live from his studio, and a magnificent 1 hour concert filmed at the Brussels City Hall with the Matthieu Saglio Quartet to finish the year with music.

CONCERT WITH YOU

We did not stop there. In view of the situation, we also have launched an online concert hall! Probably one of the first one: concertwithyou.com The aim of this platform is to first give visibility to young musicians impacted by the crisis and eager to break through but also create new opportunities for them. Indeed, the donations collected with this platform will be entirely dedicated to support young musicians to have the resources to create high quality musical content, high quality materials showing their work and produce them live when possible. With the money collected, we provide musicians with the necessary materials for recording, rehearsal and diffusion.

This forced " interlude " allowed us to think about new projects useful for our network, to build them and to present them to the various subsidiary bodies. At the same time, we have been able to strengthen our visibility and explore new communication channels for our Foundation.

This is why we enter this new period with strength and confidence, knowing that our energies focused on the values promoted by our dear Maestro Menuhin will make the difference and make us stronger in the future.

Trust, listening, courage and respect are the qualities that will carry us forward like a sailing ship on rough seas, knowing that better winds will appear sooner or later. And then we will discover the incredible amount of learning we have received during this time, allowing us to overcome our limits and making us more supportive of each other.

SOCIAL INCLUSION

IYMF has developed together with its partners « Homelands, places of belonging », a community co-creation project for and by newcomers artists who collaborate with partners from the socio-cultural sector and engage in a process of artistic co- creation with the local community. www.thehomelandsproject.com

HOMELANDS, PLACES OF BELONGINGS

"Homelands, places of belonging" is a 6 months co-creation community project for and by newcomers/refugees artists, initiated by the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation and his partners.

After a debut in 2019, "Homelands, places of belonging" has settled in and launched its second phase in 3 Belgian cities: Namur, Brussels, Antwerp.

The newcomer/refugee artists are working together with partners from the sociocultural sector and engage in a process of artistic co-creation with the local community. A colourful mix of projects will thus be created in the 3 cities with the theme of "HOMELANDS" as a common thread: an artistic research on what it means to feel at home, to belong to a place, a city or a community.

The Homelands project promotes social inclusion by creating a sustainable dialogue between Belgian citizens and newcomers/refugees through one of the most powerful tools every culture cherishes: ART.

Throughout the project, the artists and their partners will receive intensive training and advice from the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation's Artist Ambassadors and experts. The objective is to give them the opportunity not only to be a part of an artistic project and take place as an artist in society but also to make them co-create it and actively share their artistic skills with the city or community they live in to become the intercultural mediators of tomorrow.

The project is aimed at a much wider audience than the artists directly involved in the project, and reaches out to very diverse groups in society, including newcomers, refugees and young people with an immigrant background. This way we hope to foster both the feeling of empowerment and belonging of these artists and create a tangible benefit for the community.

HOMELANDS Places of belonging

1-WEEK RESIDENCY

A 1-week artistic residency was organized by the IYMF during which an (inter) national team of IYMF cultural ambassadors and experts worked with the newly formed tandems, teaching them complementary artistic activities, pedagogical and social skills needed to engage in the co-creative process and start their artistic journey in the project. This artistic residency took place in January 2020 at Château de Ry in Mohiville. The trainers were Andor Timar (HU), Raul laza (IT) and Ilse Wijnen (BE). Each day had a specific theme: from tools to come together, to starting your own project, or how to integrate a theme in your work? Each tandem had the occasion during this residency to learn more about each other but above all, the objective was to give them the necessary tools to manage a co-creative workshop, to find the balance between directing and giving space. After this training week, workshops with local communities led by the refugee and newcomer artists and their partner started over a period of 6 months.

2 ADDITIONAL TRAININGS

2 additional training sessions/master classes took place in order to address the needs and challenges that rose during the process and to prepare the result of the cocreative projects. The first one was held in February and took place at KunstZ in Atnwerp with the already known trainers Andor and Ilse. The objectives of this training were multiple: how to intervene when problematic? How to deal with multicultural talents? Is the role of each tandem member clear? How to organize a workshop? And how to improvise?

That training was an eye opener for the tandems. Probably one of the main focus was acknowledging that when dealing with a group of people you have to consider the differences between people and the fact that everyone has its own reaction and role for each situation. The second training took place in September at Le Delta in Namur with the same trainers. As this training was held after a long break in the Homelands activities due to the sanitary crisis, the main theme was a reflection on the different mindsets possible and how the artists and their cultural partners were dealing with the current situation. This training day showed the importance to communicate with each other on our expectations.

HOMELANDS IN 2020

INSIGHTS IN THE WORKSHOPS OF THE ARTISTS

During the period of 6 months, the tandems in collaboration with the local partners, initiated an artistic working process with their respective target group. This process consisted in weekly encounters/ working sessions and is inspired by the title/theme of the project "Homelands, places of belonging". The tandem together with the local communities involved gave their own answer to this theme through the arts. The process can evolve into a concert, exhibition, workshop or any other kind of artistic form.

Rock's Cool (Namur): Leandro Ramirez and Jérôme Mardaga have been working with a group of all ages, made up of about 90% of students from the music school but also of people linked to these students or who have heard about the project. Due to covid-19, they organized most of their workshops between November 2020 and January 2021 through Zoom meetings. Despite the difficulties, the result of this online collaboration has been fruitful and surprising. Together, they produced a documentary reflecting what feeling home means to them. The documentary is supported by musical pieces also made in co-creation during their workshops.

<u>GC De Kroon (Brussels)</u>: Workshops implemented by Octavio Amos, Hussein Rassim and Matthias Verhelst had well started in the second semester of 2020. They were working with youngsters from Chiro (Youth Organization). Due to the covid-19 most workshops were cancelled and could be resumed in January 2021. They are working on the creation of a unique flag as well as a music-literary performance based on texts and songs created by the participants and the artists.

<u>GC De Markten (Brussels)</u>: In the implementation of their workshops Zeinabou Hamidou Diori and Hilde Van Geel collaborated with two local organizations therefore promoting further collaborations with local social centres: <u>Hobo</u> and <u>Link=Brussel vzw</u> The work with these two local organizations consisted in an installation of small clay figures and a photo exhibition. Their series of workshops ended in mid-January 2021.

<u>Fameus (Antwerp)</u>: During the first period of workshops, Alida Heikerk and Adams Mensah worked with adults (mostly refugees) from all ages in relation to the arts. Alida made a typical clothing from Suriname (lendendoek), with the integration of the self-made jewels by the participants. Workshops have been heavily impacted by the covid-19 and especially because Adams had to go back to Ghana and could not come back to Belgium. After this period, the project could resume.

INSIGHTS IN THE WORKSHOPS OF THE ARTISTS

<u>KunstZ (Antwerp)</u>: With the help of Lore Loyens, Timur Magomedgadzhiev and Aline Leynen co-created with intercultural adults interested in theatre, a film composed of different theatre scenes and performance art around the theme of the project. They gave a public event in the end of September 2020.

At the end of each traject, an opening is planned in their respective cultural center. These events are an opportunity for our refugee artists and their participants to showcase their work in the cultural scene of their new habitat. Unfortunately, only Timur Magomedgadzhiev and Aline Leynen at KunstZ (Antwerp) had the occasion to present their work with the local community in September at l'Archipel.

In addition to these openings, "Homelands, places of belonging" puts together an exhibition with pieces of each workshop. This special show, due to the pandemic, has been postponed to early 2021.

TWISTS AND TURNS DUE TO COVID-19

This project has probably been the most impacted by the crisis as the core activities take place in cultural centers and are in the form of workshops with more than 10 people each time coming from the local communities. During the first lockdown in March, all activities were suspended and relaunched in September with the second training. Some had to find new groups, some finished their traject, and unfortunately, some decided to stop the project for personal reasons (UNamur).

The second lockdown in October hit hard but the different projects didn't hesitate to continue with the Homelands Project. At Rock's Cool (in Namur), they continued having sessions through zoom, at GC De Kroon (Brussels) they started in January with the local Chiro's, and GC de Markten (Brussels) and Fameus (Antwerp) were also able to finish their traject.

"Leandro in fact is the engine. He brings a lot of point of view that come from another culture, another continent. That's the whole point of this project, it's to be able to benefit from this experience that comes from abroad." - Jérôme Mardaga @Rock's Cool.

MUSILIB

MUSILIB is funded under the Erasmus+ programme which offers open, innovative and digital education tools which have shown their relevance and necessity during 2020. MUSILIB is the project that develops the MultiLib E-Library with new languages and e-books, and with music soundtracks for each children's story, played with traditional instruments of each culture featured in them. Local musicians along with musicians of ethnic minority cultures play together and create original music pieces inspired to the stories.

MUSILIB OPEN EDUCATION RESOURCES

Let's present the Open Education Resources which have been developed in the project and completed in 2020 and which are freely accessible on http://www.multilibproject.eu/ and Coursevo.

E-library

A vibrant multicultural e-library with traditional and contemporary children's stories of different cultures and languages: Armenian, Belgian French, Czech, English, Finnish, Greek, Haitian Creole, Kurdish, Russian, Swedish, Syrian Arabic, Tibetan and Turkish. The stories are accompanied by soundtracks with original compositions played on traditional music instruments.

Instruments library

An online library where you can discover the story of instruments from different cultures with sound, images and stories written by the children inspired by the music of the instrument.

Teacher Video kit

A kit for teachers to empower them in the use of creative writing, storytelling, making music and dancing a story. Teachers may find inspiration on how to scaffold their children in performing creative activities. It has three sessions: writing and telling a story, soundtracking a story and dancing a story. It also include 12 "how-to" videos.

MUSILIB by Children - Children multimedia stories inspired by music instruments

A collection of stories created by children in primary schools of 7 European countries! The children have gone through the MUSILIB Instrument library and have produced stories in which a music instrument is the main character or it appears in parts of the stories. They have received learning activities given by professional artists. In Belgium, Marlène Dorcéna, IYMF artist ambassador, has worked with children around the theme of the saxophone and the vaccine, a traditional Haitian instrument.

CAPACITARTE

PROJECT FOR TRAINING ADULTS AND EXCHANGE OF GOOD PRACTICES

CAPACITARTE is a training project for professionals from the artistic-pedagogical world that allows them to extend and develop their skills in non-formal methodologies active from art, creativity and culture. These professionals from the artistic-pedagogical world in non-formal methodologies through Art will reverse their learning in management teams, teachers and AMPAS of education centers located in priority attention areas.

The main priorities of the project are:

- Carry out effective training for professionals from the artistic-pedagogical world in active and innovative methodologies.
- Acquire tools that will later be applied to teachers, management teams and AMPAS of schools.
- Create an intervention NETWORK to improve learning through art at the European level.

CAPACITARTE is an Erasmus+ project led by the Fundación Yehudi Menuhin España and involves the following partners; University of Extremadura, International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation (BE), Mus-e Deutschland (DE), MUS-E Magyarország Közhasznú Egyseület (HUN), Commune di Ferno (IT), Group of Escolas Aquilino Ribeiro (PT), MUS-E Del Fermano Onlus (IT), MOCA FUTURE DESIGNERS Società Cooperativa (IT), ISC FRACASSETTI CAPODARCO (IT), NATIONAL CENTER OF CULTURE (PT).

The project collects the practices of each of the participating organizations and combines and develops a joint European training model CAPACITARTE that strengthens the European dimension and will allow to permanently implement educational keys to success that will last over time, so that they can be later implemented in other European entities.

CAPACITARTE

PROJECT FOR TRAINING ADULTS AND EXCHANGE OF GOOD PRACTICES

The International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation, as partner of the CAPACITARTE project, has suggested to share the best practices and experiences of "Homelands, places of belonging" at the European Level. Due to the sanitary crisis, none of the transnational training meeting planned for 2020 has been able to take place but that did not prevent us from staying active on a local and national level and sharing good practices with each other.

During the confinement period, CAPACITARTE shed light on the work done by one of the Homelands refugee artist: a video made by Leandro Ramirez and his partner Jérôme Mardaga.



MUS-E ON STAGE

MUS-E ON STAGE is one of the 10 projects selected in 2020 in the framework of the Prepartory Action "Music Moves Europe: Boosting European music diversity and talent" in the Creative Europe programme of the European Commission.



The project is led by the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation with our main partner the Associação Yehudi Menuhin Portugal. In this project, we also collaborate closely with 5 other MUS-E organisations: Fundación Yehudi Menuhin España, MUS-E Hungary, MUS-E Belgium, MUS-E Cyprus and MUS-E Italy. Strongly believing in the role of music in schools, MUS-E ON STAGE improves the accessibility to music education for primary school-aged children who come from underpriviledged and migrant backgrounds in Europe through the following activities which will be implemented in 2021:

CREATION OF A UNIQUE MUSIC REPERTOIRE AND PEDAGOGICAL RESOURCES

The Brussels Chamber Orchestra together with traditional Portugeuse musicians will collaborate on the creation of a music repertoire reflecting Portugal cultural diversity and richness. Based on this repertoire, the professional team of musicians an teachers will create the online resources necessary to implement music sessions in schools.

MUSIC WORKSHOPS IN HUNGARY, CYPRUS, BELGIUM, ITALY, SPAIN & PORTUGAL

Professional artists will then give music sessions in 6 European schools involved in the MUS-E Programme. They will use the resources created which involve both technical activities and more cultural content around the music selected. The project will also include digital workshops which could be replicated in more schools.

DIGITAL CHOIR

The music sessions in the 6 participating countries will lead to the recording of the children singing one common piece of music from the repertoire.

CONCERT AND BROADCASTING OF THE CHOIR


The project will culminate with the presentation of the music repertoire and the work of children with a live performance where musicians will accompany the choir of children which will have been edited.

UCREATE

UCREATE is also a Creative Europe Project led by the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation which has been selected and which has started in December 2020 until December 2022.



4 European artistic organizations based in Hungary (MUS-E Hungary), Italy (Big Sur), Portugal (HANGAR) and Belgium (International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation) join their forces to launch a training program based on co-creation and dedicated to the inclusion of young artists from cultural minorities and migrant backgrounds.



Through this project, creation is shared and we use the arts as a powerful lever for creating social bonds between individuals. Our main objective is to involve local European communities with newcomers around a common artistic project. Sharing experiences, create and achieve something together are the solutions UCREATE is implementing for the social integration of newcomers in Europe.

In addition to propose solutions for the inclusion of audiences, UCREATE is a training programme for young artists, a research around co-creation, and an artistic research of the multiple facets of what Europe is today and how we envisage its future in 4 European countries.

ADVOCACY THROUGH ERASMUS+

The International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation is an umbrella which gathers MUS-E organizations active in the field of education, training and youth coming from all over Europe and beyond.

IYMF aims to voice citizens' concerns about education and training always from the angle of practice and access to all forms of art. Yehudi Menuhin created the IYMF in order to give a voice to the voiceless, to act as a resonance box and initator and provide places for dialogue between people and public authorities. No one should be left out and bridges should be built between sectors to increase access and quality education for all. IYMF therefor promotes through all its activities and projects a hollistic vision of education and training fighting for the recognition of the value of the arts in all learning. This makes a somewhat original beneficiary

of the **Erasmus+** Programme for civil society cooperation in the field of education and training which support us in pursuing the following objectives:

- Raise stakeholder awareness of European policy agendas in education, training and youth, in particular Europe 2020, Education and Training 2020, specific policy agendas such as the Bologna or the Riga-Copenhagen processes, the European Agenda for Adult Learning, or the EU Youth Strategy;
- Increase stakeholder commitment and cooperation with public authorities for the implementation of policies and reforms in the fields of education and training and of youth, in particular the country-specific recommendations issued in the framework of the European Semester;
- Boost stakeholder participation in the field of education, training and youth;
- Boost stakeholder involvement in the dissemination of policy and programme actions and results and of good practice among their membership and beyond.

Our vision is meant to ensure equity, social inclusion as well as active citizenship. Through our activities and statutory meetings, we create spaces for dialogue and exchange of innovative practices, methodologies, Europe-wide. Based on them, we intend to initiate more cooperation parterships and projects.

OUR CONCERTS IN 2020

2020 has pushed us to reinvent and adapt. The International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation has therefore found other ways to support musicians, to enable them to make music, to share and to continue. We look back at the year's most important concerts and the creation of a unique platform.

CADE L'OLIVA: IYMF ARTISTS AMBASSADORS FIRST LOCKDOWN COLLABORATION

In April 2020, the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation has reunited some of its artists ambassadors to perform together but at a distance the popular Italian song "Cadel'oliva", a song of love and life that particularly resonated at that time.

A CONCERT FROM HOME WITH MATTHIEU SAGLIO

Shortly after, in May 2020, we discovered the possibilities offered by the live streaming always with our ambassador artists. That time, we were delighted to organize a live concert of more than 30 minutes with Matthieu Saglio who presented his sublime new album "El Camino de los vientos". Convinced that this does not replace the beauty of being able to experience music outside of the screen, we decided to stay connected with people by continuing to offer them musical moments. Moreover, it is a way for us to continue to support the musicians and offer them work opportunities when everything is at a standstill.





FROM US TO YOU: HOW TO END THE YEAR WITH MAGIC

CONCERTWITHYOU: AN ONLINE VIRTUAL STAGE FOR MUSICIANS



MUS-E SINCE 1993

The MUS-E project was initiated in 1993 by Yehudi Menuhin (1916-1999), an outstanding violonist and humanist, together with Werner Schmitt, director of the Bern Conservatory, and Marianne Poncelet. Yehudi Menuhin envisioned a Europe where more and more people of various nationalities and cultures live and make it their place of belonging. He was convinced by his own experience that the path of art is the path to communicate, to understand, thus, to coexist in a peaceful way. The context to implement this vision he found in education, as the basis of society.

AIM: By implementing art and practicing the arts on a daily basis from the earliest age, MUS-E reinforces school education and personal development. It thereby promotes inclusion, respect and diversity and encourages dialogue and togetherness in a transcultural society.

CONTEXT - FIELDS OF ACTION

In alignment with The United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC 1989, Articles 28, 29, 30, 31), MUS-E gives priority to investment in one of the basic building blocks of society, which is school education. Art and school education mutually enrich one another while having a strong impact on social dynamics.

- MUS-E helps schools to open up to the outside world: the neighbourhood, the town, cultural and social life and to involve families in their children's development.
- MUS-E focuses on mutual respect and it is intended for all children. Up to now, it
 has targeted children living in districts where there are significant risks of social
 exclusion and where schools have to cope with multiculturalism and acute societal
 problems and high social vulnerability.
- Participating schools are open to transcultural dialogue and can belong to all types of educational networks, independent of pedagogical approach.
- In its present form, MUS-E is targeted at primary schools, with a possible extension to nursery schools, secondary schools and special schools.
- MUS-E creates and provides a platform for artists, enabling them to explore more opportunities to fulfil their role in society.
- MUS-E is established at European level, which makes it possible to build connections between children, artists and teachers in all the participating countries and regions.

MUS-E ASSOCIATIONS


The MUS-E Network currently comprises the national associations of Belgium, Cyprus, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Kosovo, Liechtenstein, Portugal, Spain and Switzerland. The Network also counts 2 national associations outside Europe: Israel and Brazil. We are in discussions with local partners to revive or establish new associations in other parts of Europe including in France, Finland, Estonia, Malta Austria and the UK. MUS-E Switzerland is the oldest association, founded in 1993 and still led by IYMF Board Member Werner Schmitt.

Other MUS-E Associations founded in the first decade of the network include Hungary (MUSE Magyarország - 1994), Portugal (Associação Yehudi Menuhin Portugal - 1996), Italy (MUSE Italia - 1999), Spain (Fundación Yehudi Menuhin España - 1999), and MUS-E Belgium (2000). More recent associations are MUS-E Israel (MUS-E Israel Education programs in the Arts -2008), MUS-E Kosovo (2009), MUS-E Germany (2013) and MUS-E Cyprus (2018). In 2019. MUS-E Brazil (Cultural and Educational Center for the Development of Citizenship - MUS-E) joined the network.

MUS-E is active in 12 countries around the world including: Cyprus, Kosovo, Portugal, Brazil, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Israel, Belgium, Hungary, Italy, Spain and Germany. The number of schools and institutions involved in the programme has increased by 130 between 2018 and 2019.

MUS-E DIGITAL INNOVATION



While the challenges of creating a more cohesive society are still present Covid19 has add unprecedented difficulties to our work.. Although challenging, MUS-E together with their artists and teachers have proven to be inventive to promote and develop new teaching initiatives and keep on providing access to education through the arts.

INSPIRING NEWS FROM THE MUS-E NETWORK

Following the pandemic, MUS-E activities in schools were obviously deeply impacted. Creativity and innovation were needed in order to achieve the education objectives of the programme. During this year, the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation sent questionnaires to the MUS-E member organizations in order to identify the main challenges, needs and priorities of the Network. It also served to have a broad overview of the best practices among the Network and facilitate the exchange and learning between the different organizations. Furthermore, based on this analysis, the International Yehudi Menuhin Foundation tried to implement collaboration projects between the MUS-E and transnational activities such as with the project MUS-E ON STAGE project which was presented in 2020 and selected by the European Commission in the end of the year.

Let's come back on some national initiatives that were implemented during the year 2020.

ITALY - "RICANTIAMO MUS-E"!

Mus-e Italy had to remoduclate this choral concert of children from the National Muse choir. Specifically, using the systems of distance learning activated in each school and the collaboration of teachers, the children resumed their vocal exercise on music guides in mp3 format made specifically for them on the overall registers already studied, which was followed by the video recording of their performance through simple smartphones. ΑII the papers were mounted in a unique final video product that collected everyone's performance. In order to propose a highly inclusive activity, any difficulties raised by specific cases of families children and have found compensatory and alternative measures to involve everyone.

SPAIN - "ARTE CONTRA EL CORONAVIRUS"

For public health reasons, Art cannot now be performed in traditional spaces, from schools to theatres or auditoriums, although human inventiveness is finding But confinement is timeother ways. When we overcome this limited. emergency situation, the world will not go back to the way it was before, and to reconsider the frenzy of movement and incommunication of today's world, art in all its dimensions has to play a decisive role. That is why we emphasise that in this period of confinement 'The school is not closed, the buildings are closed. In this framework, the teachers continued their work with vocation and conviction. And with them, the artists and collaborators of the Foundation, who present serie of video tutorials.

BELGIUM - MUS-E DURING SUMMER

During the summer of 2020, MUS-E Belgium was on the move! Their artists worked in summer plains. summer schools, art centres and at the Park Poétik festival. In total, 19 five-day projects took place: they created, experimented, improvised and above all had fun. Children - and sometimes adults - were introduced to all kinds of artistic disciplines in a playful way. Related to the idea of STAYCATION Mus-e Belgium organised a total of 20 projectweeks in Brussel during the summer and reached over 500 children.

Mus-e Kosova has been implementing a European project: "Promotion of Cultural Heritag Among Youth Through Okarina" is a project is financed by European Unionmanaged by Eu Office in Kosovo and implemented by IKS, LENS and FES, with the aim to promote cultural heritage among young people through OKARINA. The young people are learning how to make okarina, and the importance of this old instrument.



MUS-E SWITZERLAND - TESTEMONY FROM A MOTHER

As a mother of a MUS-E child, it has been interesting for me over the last two years to listen to what exciting things my daughter had to say after the MUS-E lessons. Building cardboard huts, singing, dancing, listening to stories, celebrating story night, handicrafts, painting pictures and presenting them at an exhibition, moving and much, much more.... Every time my daughter came home with brightly painted clothes, I knew that there was a lot of joy, fun and creativity on the school grounds that morning. It's great that the children are allowed to develop their creativity at school. The encounter with the various artists was a great enrichment in my daughter's everyday life. THANK YOU!

HUNGARY - MUS-E DIGITAL PROJECT

Mus-e Hungary has created 28 episodes for kids with interactive, artistic impulses and challenges based on their age group and the content of their school curriculum. Through this digital project they managed to 1. Stay in touch with and provide support to MUS-E students, families, artists and teachers 2. Reach a wider audience and make their activities accessible to those outside of the MUS-E program using online mediums 3. Nourish the creativity and social needs of children during a difficult period of physical isolation. An additional fruit of this labour is the national grant they to continue down the path of digitalization and create a 12-episode series of short films.

GERMANY - MUS-E IS EXPANDING!

Yehudi Menuhin would have had a great pleasure, to see, that Mus-e Germany had established in the famous city of Joh. Seb. Bach Köthen, where he lived and composed some of his most famous works, f.e. the sonatas and partitas for violin solo. With the city of Köthen, Mus-e Germany is now present in the new federal states of Germany (former GDR). The opening ceremony was attended by the Mayor of Köthen. Despite the pandemic, they managed to expand classes!

BRAZIL - HELPING THE COMMUNITY

Unfortunately, all activities had to stop in March 2020. However, Mus-e Brazil has been involved in helping families of children and adolescents from their schools such as the distribution of masks, hygienic kit, food baskets, etc.



ISRAEL - EMPHASIZING EMOTIONAL CHALLENGES

During Israel's first lockdown, which included travel restrictions lasting from early March until the end of April, the Jaffa Institute (Mus-e Israël) ceased in-person at its After-School programming Educational Enrichment Centers in order to protect the children and staff, as well as the people with whom they come in contact. In an effort to maintain continuity and contact with the children to ensure that the children had a healthy and productive outlet for social-emotional challenges during stay-at-home measures, Arts Education Program, and specifically the music lessons, transitioned to remote learning via Zoom.

This year, Yonatan shared with his music instructor that he especially enjoyed the virtual one-on-one music lessons, especially the lessons that included "household musical instruments," such as pots and pans. These lessons provided Yonatan with the support needed to distract him from the stress at home. Through observation we can see that these lessons have contributed greatly to this child's emotional state and have provided him with the social interaction he needs in order to pass the lockdown period.

PORTUGAL - PROJECTS FROM EACH CITY IN 2020

MUS-E Oeiras has developed sessions of musical expression, sound, performance and multimedia, dramatic expression / theater, dramatic expression movement and creative writing and and begun the Erasmus+ Project CapacitArte.

Mus-e Évora organised the ending show of Erasmus+ Project Arte por la Convivencia before the pandemic. When the pandemic situation became an unavoidable reality, the "Once upon a time ... the book" and # CáemCasaoArtistaSouEu projects were developed.





In the year 2020, the MUS-E Leiria restarted in two schools of the Agrupamento de Escolas de Marrazes. Each with 8 classes, between 6 and 10 years of age.

Mus-e Lisboa. Within the scope of the Erasmus+ "Creando Puentes" Project, AYMP established a partnership with the Museum National of Theater and Dance (MNTD). These visits and workshops had to be stopped in March 2020, due to the pandemic caused by Covid19, and started again in April 2021.

ALTEA NARICI

Altea is 24, she was born in Italy and she likes to be referred to as an artist, traveller-performer and community engager. She holds a Bachelor in Psychology and a Master Diploma in Cello from the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia. Altea has been playing in orchestras and ensembles for most of her life. Altea sings, plays and composes while traveling and solo performing. Her music is inspired by traditional songs and by the natural environment, and she collaborates with researchers in a joint project of marine science outreach. She loves to discover music and stories from different cultures as a source of inspiration for her own work. She was recently invited for her first solo residencies at the Celacanto Cultural Centre in Puglia (Italy) and at the Sitka Center for Art and Ecology in Oregon (USA).

NEW WORLDS PROJECT

Altea imagined to expand and deepen this experience at the Sitka Center and research to more native cultures, traditional music, storytelling and arts, as well as to explore natural environments, reflect about border-crossing social themes and engage with local communities in Canada and Mexico. 


